Explorer Days

Our Explorer Days are fully inclusive, interactive, cross-curricular activities. A truly unique learning experience offering excellent value for money. Our young visitors will spend all day with us (usually 1030-1415) exploring our site and the variety of subjects we cover. Each Explorer Day will include a 90 minute indoor session and a 90 minute outdoor session that meets National Curriculum requirements and Ofsted inspection frameworks.

Short on time?

If you are restricted on time, or would like to add a short activity to a self-led visit, why not try one of our popular shorter activities?

Poppy Activity

A thought-provoking interactive session that develops an understanding of the historic and symbolic significance of the poppy, whilst promoting British Values and respect when learning about Remembrance.

Act of Remembrance

Participants reflect on the key themes of Remembrance and consolidate this learning by performing an Act of Remembrance with readings and recitative provided by us. Groups may personalise the act with their own readings, poems and songs if they wish. This activity is differentiated for age groups. * Prices valid for visits before September 2020.

Guided Tours

Our interactive guided tours are led by specially trained Learning Guides who are adept at engaging with our younger visitors. They encompass a number of emotive and symbolic memorials from civilian groups as well as military associations. We offer a variety of tours (some of which are listed in the table above). KS1 and KS2 visitors have the option of conducting an Activity Book Tour with an accompanying fun workbook.

Indoor Activity Students will learn about the different roles and responsibilities of a wide range of people beyond the Tommy in the trench. In this interactive and creative activity, students work both in groups and individually building on social and emotional development and fine motor skills to produce a WWI armband to take away. We can accommodate up to four groups (100 students) per day for this activity. Indoor Activity This cross-curricular activity ensures that students learn about the symbolism behind a variety of medals (not just military). The activity involves discussion work and the sharing of thoughts and ideas with themes of British values and public service running throughout. The activity culminates in students designing their own medals to present to someone who has had a positive effect on their lives. We can accommodate up to four groups (100 students) per day for this activity.	Indoor Activity This offer is aimed at students enrolled on qualifications with a coursework element. You will receive access to one of our fully-equipped classrooms with IT and smartboard facilities, so your students can focus on their coursework throughout their day here. We recommend that you talk to one of our Learning Officers about your requirements before booking your Inspiration Day. We can accommodate up to two groups (50 students) per day for this activity.	 Indoor Activity Students will develop their knowledge about the world using sources such as maps, diagrams and aerial images to make their own map of the Arboretum and construct basic symbols in a key. During the activity students will identify: physical features, including rivers, soil, woodlands and forests human features, including buildings, offices, shop and restaurant. We can accommodate up to two groups (50 students) per day for this activity. 	Indoor Activity This activity explores the stories of British people, from very different backgrounds, who all took risks and showed great courage and determination in order to save the lives of Jewish people during the Holocaust. Each has now been awarded a medal as a 'British Hero of the Holocaust' by the UK government. Students will identify reasons for the actions of some British heroes and why some people became rescuers during the Holocaust. We can accommodate up to four groups (100 students) per day for this activity.

Self-Led Activities

We require all visiting groups to complete a booking form prior to arrival.

Exhibition: FREE

Journey through a history of Remembrance from ancient burial mound rituals through to contemporary social media tributes. Surround yourself by the changing seasons as you travel through a year in the Arboretum. Discover the stories behind some of our memorials and explore the symbolism in their designs. Enjoy walking through our path of leaves, revealing the poppy field beneath. Complement your literacy sessions by enabling pupils to recount a personal remembrance story in our memory booth. This includes entry to the current exhibition in gallery two.

Self-Led Resources

All of our self-led documents are free to download from our website; however, a suggested donation of £1 per download is appreciated.

These resources are aimed at teachers and group leaders who wish to make the most of any self-led time and help develop key skills such as problem solving and team work. They are a helpful starting point for any pre-visit classroom time, and can be used separately or as a complete set.
